Day 1: Sun, Oct 18 — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu.

Day 2: Mon, Oct 19 — NAHA. Arrive Naha. After entry formalities, transfer by coach to hotel in Naha. HOTEL JAL CITY NAHA (3 Nights)

Day 3: Tue, Oct 20 — NAHA. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast at your hotel, we embark on a full day of discovery! First stop this morning is **Shuri Castle (Shurijo)**, the most important castle of the Ryukyu Kingdom, serving both as the central government office and royal residence. The present buildings are beautiful reconstructions from 1992. Shurijo is the only castle in Okinawa that has been reconstructed. Only ruins remain of all the other castles. Stop at Naha Main Place, the largest shopping mall in Naha, with time for shopping and lunch on your own. After lunch, we will visit two of the World War II memorial sites. We will start with Himeyuri-no-to Memorial Park, which commemorates the fate of the female high school students that had worked in the army field hospitals under horrendous conditions — many of which did not survive the war. Next is **Mabuni Hill**, which is an open space in the **Okinawa Prefectural Memorial Park**. It is the place where U.S. forces and Japanese forces battled against each other during World War II and has a tragic history. It has been established as an open space of peace, which includes a monument entitled "Heiwa no Oka (Hill of Peace)," a war memorial, and the Peace Memorial Museum. Let your creative side loose when you **make and decorate a Shisa**, a traditional Ryukyuan cultural artifact and decoration. Often seen in pairs and resemble a cross between a lion and a dog, shisa are from Okinawan mythology, and are believed to protect from some evils. People place pairs of shisa on their rooftops or flanking gates to their houses, with the left shisa traditionally has a closed mouth, the right one an open mouth. The open mouth shisa traditionally wards off evil spirits, while the closed mouth shisa keeps good spirits in. This evening enjoy a special **Ryukyu music and dance show** during dinner. (B, D)

Day 4: Wed, Oct 21 — NAHA. Another full day of exploring is ahead! Spend the day exploring **Okinawa World**, a theme park about Okinawan culture. The park's main attractions are a massive natural cave, a craft village and a snake museum. With a total length of five kilometers, **Gyokusendo Cave** is the longest of the many caves in the south of Okinawa Island and the second longest cave in the entire country. 850 meters of the cave are open to the public and feature spectacular stalactites and stalagmites. The **Kingdom Village** is a nice replica of a traditional Ryukyu village with workshops introducing the various traditional Okinawan crafts, such as weaving, dyeing, paper making, pottery, sugar cane processing, the making of music instruments and the more recently introduced glass blowing. Colorful Ryukyu glass is one of those must have souvenirs when visiting Okinawa. Taking a tour of the work shop allows visitors to see how the craftsmen create their art. Hands-on experiences are offered at many of the workshops. Later, take a tour of the **Masahiro Sake Brewery** and taste a few of their products. Return to the hotel. (B)

Day 5: Thur, Oct 22 – NAHA – TOKYO. Fly from Naha to Tokyo. Stop at **LaLaport Toyosu**, a mall located on Tokyo Bay that has 180 shops, including UNIQLO, DAISO and more before transferring to the hotel. The remainder of the day is at your leisure. GRAND NIKKO TOKYO DAIBA (1 Night) (B)

Day 6: Fri, Oct 23 — TOKYO — YOKOHAMA — EMBARK NORWEGIAN SPIRIT. After breakfast, travel to Yokohama and visit the **Sankeien Garden** — a spacious Japanese-style garden in southern Yokohama which exhibits a number of historic buildings from across Japan. There is a pond, small rivers, flowers and wonderful strolling trails that make you think you are in Kyoto rather than Yokohama. We then visit **Minato Mirai**, a prominent business district near the Yokohama port. Besides a park, great views of the port, a recreation ground with a Ferris wheel and a museum, Minato Mirai is filled with restaurants and numerous shops. Spend some time there shopping before going to **Yokohama's China Town** for lunch. After lunch, transfer to the pier for embarkation on the Norwegian Spirit. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Sat, Oct 24 — AT SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Sun, Oct 25 – HAKODATE, JAPAN. 7:00 am – 5:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Mon, Oct 26 – OTARU (SAPPORO), JAPAN. 7:00 am – 7:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Tue, Oct 27 — AT SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Wed, Oct 28 — KANAZAWA, JAPAN. 6:00 am — 5:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Thur, Oct 29 — BUSAN, SOUTH KOREA. 3:00 pm — 9:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 13: Fri, Oct 30 — NAGASAKI, JAPAN. 8:00 am — 7:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 14: Sat, Oct 31 — CRUISING KANMON STRAIT. BEPPU, JAPAN. 11:00 am — 6:00 pm (B, L, D)

Day 15: Sun, Nov 01 - OSAKA (KYOTO), JAPAN. 11:00 am - Overnight in port. (B, L, D)

Day 16: Mon, Nov 02 — OSAKA (KYOTO), JAPAN. Depart 5:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 17: Tue, Nov 03 — NAGOYA, JAPAN. 8:00 am — 7:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 18: Wed, Nov 04 — SHIMIZU (MT. FUJI), JAPAN. 7:00 am — 6:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 19: Thur, Nov 05 — DISEMBARK NORWEGIAN SPIRIT — YOKOHAMA — KAMAKURA — TOKYO. After disembarkation, head to Kamakura for some fun shopping at **Komachi Dori**, a 360 meter long shopping street full of restaurants and stores. Then, visit **Tsurugaoka Hachimangu** which is dedicated to Hachiman, the patron god of the Minamoto family and of the samurai in general. Next visit the **Hase Shrine**, a temple of the Jodo sect, famous for its eleven-headed statue of Kannon, the goddess of mercy. The 9.18 meter tall wooden statue is regarded as one of the largest wooden sculptures in Japan. After lunch at a local restaurant, visit the grounds of **Kotokuin Temple** and the **Kamakura Daibutsu (The Great Buddha of Kamakura)**. A bronze statue of Amida Buddha, the statue reaches a height of 11.4 meters and has long been the second tallest bronze Buddha statue in Japan, surpassed only by the statue in Nara's Todaiji Temple and some recent creations. Transfer to the hotel for the evening. GRAND NIKKO TOKYO DAIBA (2 Nights) (B, L)

Day 20: Fri, Nov 06 — TOKYO — NIKKO — TOKYO. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast, we head north of Tokyo to Nikko. Nikko is a town at the entrance to Nikko National Park, most famous for **Toshogu Shrine**, Japan's most lavishly decorated shrine and the mausoleum of Tokugawa leyasu, the founder of the Tokugawa shogunate. Then explore the historic theme park, **Edo Wonderland**, that recreates a 17th century Edo period Japanese village. Explore the beauty, culture and interesting characters of the Edo period with fun activities and a variety of entertaining performances. Enjoy a special BBQ lunch. Next explore **Tobu World Square**, an architectural museum that has reproductions of 102 world famous buildings on a 1/2s scale. Take a picture next to the Statue of Liberty, the Pyramids, the Eiffel Tower, the Leaning Tower of Pisa, the Great Wall of China, Taj Mahal and the White House all in one day! Return to Tokyo, where the remainder of the day is at your leisure. (B, L)

Day 21: Sat, Nov 07 – TOKYO – HONOLULU. After breakfast, visit **Tokyo Skytree** for a view of the surrounding city. At just over 2,000 feet tall, it is the tallest tower in Tokyo. Rising 350 meters above the ground, the Tokyo Skytree Tembo Deck offers a 360 degree panoramic view of Tokyo. Next, tour the **Edo Tokyo Museum**, which vividly illustrates the past of Tokyo (known as Edo until 1869) through its exhibits. Visitors are able to experience and learn about various aspects of what life was like during the Edo period. After lunch, stop at **AEON Mall** before transferring to the airport for the flight home. Depart Tokyo and arrive Honolulu the same day. Aloha and Welcome Home! (B, L)
